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

To promote healthy and inclusive communities in Agenskalns neighbourhood in Riga by developing Agenskalns market into an open and creative food hub.

Directions of work

- 1. Sport and playground infrastructure
- 2. Community kitchen as a social laboratory for healthy food
- 3. Eco-island and waste reduction site
- 4. Online food purchasing system


Activities planned



IN-HABIT in Riga: Activities so far

ESTABLISHMENT OF THE RIGA IN-HUB

- Core team established (bi-weekly online meetings)
- Stakeholder mapping performed
- Structure of IN-HUB discussed and internally agreed upon (three concentric circles)
- IN-HUB discussed at stakeholder workshop in December 2020
- Local community activators selected (training events in March & April 2021)
- Open call for User Advisory Board (published on Kalnciema Quarter social media, various stakeholders approached directly)
 - 9 members selected, 4 thematic sub-groups proposed
 - First meeting scheduled on 31 March
 - Memorandum of understanding drafted (to be signed by all members)



Next steps in Riga IN-HUB activity


- Advisory Board meetings, public consultation spring, summer 2021
- Elaboration of Visionary and Integrated Solutions Plan autumn 2021
- Co-design and implementation of 'hard' and 'soft' actions 2022-2025
- Continuous monitoring, consultation and evaluation

Theoretical frameworks: relational space

Concepts	Definitions	Āgenskalns market
Absolute space	Composed of physical boundaries and artefacts	STRONG
Relative space	Composed of institutional divides and cooperation	MEDIUM
Relational space	Composed of network ties	STRONG
Smart development	Identifying, prioritising and supporting smart growth initiatives	STRONG

- ✓ Digital governance




